Preface

I'm very proud to invite you to the 14th Open World Championships of Stratego, which will be held in North Shields (Near to Newcastle), England. Situated in the North East of England and close to the Scottish border, this is the first time the World Championships of Stratego have been held in England for 11 years (the last time was the 4th Open World Championships of Stratego at Alexandra Palace, London, Aug 2000). Indeed this is also the first time England has held the World Championships outside of London.

This invitation provides information about game schedules, tournament rules and route description to the location. There is also information about the possibilities of overnight stay in the area. The venue is ideally situated within walking distance of the Newcastle International Ferry Terminal & has great transport links to both Whitley Bay (3.5 miles) & Newcastle City Centre (8 miles). The Metro (Tram) runs past the venue & links both Whitley Bay to the centre of Newcastle.





We have 5 days of Stratego events which truly will be the highlight of the 2011 Stratego calendar. This year will be the first time that the World Championships of Stratego Duel, Stratego Barrage & Ultimate Lightning Stratego, will all be played alongside the World Championships of Classic Stratego. Some will come just for the main event (Classic) but I do hope many will take this chance to compete in more than 1 event. To help encourage players to play all the events on offer, we have introduced one final tournament: The Strategothon tournament which is based upon the Pentamind tournament at the Mind Sports Olympics (MSO). The scoring system for the Strategothon will be exactly the same as is used in the Pentamind tournament. The only difference is that there are only 4 events and these events are fixed. With all the events on offer I do hope you can join us for what promises to be an especially nice and memorable Stratego vacation. In addition to this if anyone competes in all 5 days, you will receive a very special & unique Stratego gift to mark the achievement.

Let me tell you (probably as a new player) more about our beautiful and challenging game Stratego.

Two armies line up against one another in this classic board game of battlefield strategy. The object of the game is to capture your opponent's flag or to defeat the opponent's army (while defending your own flag) using your skill, strategy & bluff. People who have never heard of the game often ask me what popular game it is most like. My answer is that Stratego is a combination of the strategy of chess with the psychology of poker. Unlike 'full information' mind games like chess, in Stratego the strengths of the pieces is concealed, and the deployment of troops at the start of the

game is therefore secret. As the ranks of pieces engaging in actual battle are disclosed, slowly the battle order and the strategy of the two opponents are disclosed. This makes Stratego a very dynamic mind sport based on information gathering, statistics and risk-minimization. Having analytical, tactical and memory skill requirements in common, this 'incomplete information' element is what distinguishes Stratego from many other mind sports, as it results in a strong psychological element of deceit and surprise.

As I explained earlier, this year's WC will (for the first time ever) involve all the Stratego WC events in one complete program. For this reason and especially for new players I think it is important to quickly explain the differences in these games compared to the original.

Stratego Duel & Barrage are both short versions of the Classic board game. Sometimes called speed Stratego these 2 variants are played in exactly the same way as the Classic game but have less pieces. Both Stratego Duel & Barrage are quick, fun & less predictable then the original game owing to having a higher psychological element to the game.

Ultimate Lightning (UL) on the other hand is a dynamic hybrid version of the original board game. While it is played on the original board it does have some important rule differences making the game more strategic and chess like, than the original. This game is fast paced and the ability to rescue captured/lost pieces means the game can change very quickly with just one rescue.

One of the great aspects of the Stratego World Championships is the excellent camaraderie that exists between the players. Often players will hang around at the end of the Stratego day and talk of their great Stratego battles over some beers and then maybe go and enjoy some food together. Later in the evening while some go to bed to get much needed rest, many will stay up till the early hours of the morning playing other games or maybe even some more Stratego. These are the real Stratego fanatics! These are the people that make for great World Championships!

Stratego has it all! Stratego has action, excitement, sensation, emotion and above all, fanatical players who live for the game. I am really looking forward to the 2011 WC and hope to meet you there.

The location:

The Parks Leisure Centre


Howdon Road North Shields NE29 6TL





The venue we chose for the 2011 Stratego WC was the parks leisure centre in North Shields. It has lots of facilities under one roof and has already hosted other prestigious mind sport events. One of the big reasons this venue was choosen over so many other possibilities was because of it's close proximity to the International ferry terminal, making it very easy to access for anyone using the ferry. The venue is only a 5 minute drive (or 20 minutes walk) from the ferry terminal. It also has good public

transport links to the coastal resort of Whitley Bay, where there is lots of accommodation available and plenty of things to do in the evening. The Metro (tram) link runs past the venue & links the venue to Whitley Bay & Newcastle. The Metro line which is 5 minutes walk from the venue also links the venue to Newcastle International Airport & both Train & Bus Stations in Newcastle.





Food and beverages:

The Parks has an on-site catering service, serving snacks and light meals. The centre of North Shields is a short walk from the Parks, and offers a range of catering outlets. The nearby Fish Quay offers high quality Fish and Chips as well as restaurants and pubs.

There is a wide range of restaurant, takeaway and pub grub provision in Whitley Bay: Newcastle, of course, has a lively night life.

There will be information at the event regarding music, theatre and film entertainment in the area during the Championships.

Car parking:

There is lots of car parking available at the venue. All **car parking is free at the venue**.

Possibilities to stay the night:

There are numerous hotels & B&B's available in Whitley Bay and I have attached a pdf visitor guide for anyone not wishing to stay in any of the 3 hotels I recommend here.

Route description:

By Car:

Travelling from the North on the A1, take the A19 (Tyne Tunnel) and then take the A193. Turn right at the second roundabout, onto Waterville Rd. At the roundabout turn right onto Howdon Rd. The venue will be on your right hand side.

Travelling from the South on the A1M, take the A194 (M) and the A19 (Tyne Tunnel). Exiting the Tyne Tunnel on the A19, turn right onto Howdon Rd (A187). The venue will be on your left hand side. N.B. There is a toll payable at the Tyne Tunnel.

By Sea:

DFDS operate daily sailings to and from Amsterdam. The International Ferry Terminal is in North Shields and is only 5 minutes drive or 20 minutes by foot.

Prices for a one way journey from Amsterdam to Newcastle start from £29 per person (based on 4 people sharing). For information visit: www.dfdsseaways.co.uk/ferry-routes/holland/foot-passenger

By Air:

Flights to International destinations including many European destinations and operate from Newcastle International Airport. There is a Metro Station at the Airport that links the airport straight to the venue. For those who wish to fly a little cheaper then there are also available cheap budget airlines flying to airports around the UK that may be cheaper than a direct flight to Newcastle. Some examples: Amsterdam to Newcastle return flights from 149 Euro. Germany to Newcastle return flights from 168 Euro. Other Airports: Easy Jet has Amsterdam to Manchester for 69 Euro (Inc. all taxes) for the duration of the WC. Ryan Air has Dusseldorf to Leeds/Bradford is 38 Euro return (Inc. all taxes) for the period of the WC. Also with Ryan Air, Eindhoven to London/Stansted is 44 Euro return (Inc. all taxes). By Cycle:

By Coach:

Coaches from London to Newcastle take 6-7 hours, but prices are cheap (for best prices book early). Prices start from £1 per person one way with Megabus.

By Train:

London and Manchester are 3 hours away by train, Edinburgh 2 hours & Leeds is 1 hour 30 mins. EuroStar: Dutch Flyer =Any Dutch train station to London takes 4 to 5 hours. (£89 for return ticket) London to Newcastle by train from £13 per person one way (book early to get best prices) Manchester Airport to Newcastle by train from £14 per person one way (again, try to book early to get best prices) Leeds to Newcastle by train from £6.50 per person one way (try to book early to get best prices).

Also there will be a reduction/subsidy for: All new players from the UK who wish to try any of the events for the first time. Through this reduction we hope to encourage more participation within the UK.

Tournament regulation & organisation

Tournament regulation

- The Open WC Stratego 2011 will be held according to the ISF Tournament Regulations and ISF Game Rules, which are available at www.isfstratego.com (The only exception to this rule occurs in Ultimate Lightning where basic rule differences succeed ISF Game rules.)
- Every player who knows the basic Stratego rules is qualified to participate. These rules will be explained before the tournament.
- The tournament will be accompanied by an Organisation and Referee-Team. Their orders are binding and participants have to be acted upon immediately.
- Seniors will play with old pieces. Juniors (born in 1997 or later) will play with the new pieces.
- Each WC will be played according to the Swiss Perfect System. This means every participant will play all 10 rounds of the tournament (no Knock-Out system) in Classic. (For Barrage or Duel entrants there will be 8 rounds, For UL there will be 6 rounds). Players will play against participants of equal strength.
- The game time for seniors Classic is 60 minutes plus 5 minutes setup time. The time on the clock is 14.05 (14 minutes personal time for thinking, 5 seconds are free per move). After 60 minutes the game ends in a draw. For Barrage & Duel each match will consist of 2 x 10 minute games plus 2 minutes setup time per game. The time on the clock is 02.03 (2 minutes personal time for thinking, 3 seconds are free per move). After 10 minutes the game ends in a draw. In UL the game time is 30 minutes plus 3 minutes setup time. The time on the clock is 05.03 (5 minutes personal time for thinking, 3 seconds per move). After 30 minutes the game ends in a draw.
- The game time for juniors Classic is 50 minutes plus 5 minutes setup time. The time on the clock is 12.04 (12 minutes personal time for thinking, 4 seconds are free per move). After 50 minutes the game ends in a draw. For juniors playing in Barrage, Duel or UL, the juniors will use exactly the same clock settings as the seniors. (see above)
- Both seniors and juniors are allowed to play without clocks only if both players agree. If one
 player would like to play the game with using the clock, then both players have to use the clock
 during the game.
- After the Individual WC Stratego Classic Seniors, the best four players of each country will qualify for the WC Team Competition. Each national team will consist of at least 3 participants.
- The Strategothon tournaments will use the same points scoring system as the <u>Pentamind</u> tournament at the MSO.




